RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR
COUNSELLING AND ADMISSION IN Part-I of
MD (Homoeopathy)
FOR THE ACADEMIC SESSION 2025-26
IN THE HOMOEOPATHY PG COLLEGES IN RAJASTHAN

A. DIRECTIVES FOR COUNSELLING AUTHORITIES (CENTRAL/STATE/UT)

A. DIRECTIVE FOR COUNSELLING AUTHORITIES (Central/State/UT)

I. Directive for Central/State/UT Counselling and /admissions

Eligibility Criteria to Participate in the Counselling. -

1. Colleges/Institute who have received permission from the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Homoeopathy (MARBH) of National Commission for Homoeopathy (NCH)/Government of India, New Delhi, for admission to Homoeopathy -PG courses for the academic session 2025-26 shall only be eligible to participate in the Counselling process

Seat matrix (AIQ & State/UT Quota)

2. The seat matrix for admission in the Government, Government-aided institutions, and Private Institutions shall be fifteen percent (15%) for All-India Quota and eighty-five percent (85%) for State/Union Territory Quota as specified in the NCH Act 2020/ NCH (Homoeopathy Post-Graduate Degree Course- Doctor of Medicine in Homoeopathy) Regulations, 2025 for admissions in Homoeopathy-PG courses, or regulations in force at the time of admission.

Provided that-

- i. The AIQ for the purpose of admission in all the Deemed Universities (both Government and Private - established under Central Act), shall be hundred percent;
 - ii. the University and institute, which are already having more than fifteen percent All-India Quota seats, shall continue to maintain that quota;
 - iii. five per cent. of the annual sanctioned intake capacity in Government and Government-aided institutions shall be filled up by candidate with specified disability in accordance with the provisions of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016) and based on the merit list of AIAPGET-2025.
3. In case of 85% of State/UT quota, the seat matrix for Government Quota, Management Quota, NRI quota etc., shall be as per respective State and UT policy; however, all admissions in all quotas (except foreign nationals) shall be through Counselling conducted by State/UT Counselling authority.
 4. The Management seats under the State/UT Quota in Private Institutions shall be treated as domicile-free.

Reservation

5. Category-wise reservation of seats shall be as per Central or State or UT Reservation Policy, as the case may be.
6. Reservation for allotment of 15% AIQ-PG seats in Private Homoeopathy Institutes: - all AIQ- PG seats of Private Institutes are open in nature (all category candidates are eligible). However, as mentioned in relevant regulations, the relaxation in qualifying criteria may be provided category-wise.

Counseling and Admissions

7. All sanctioned/permitted seats by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Homoeopathy (MARBH)/NCH/Government of India, irrespective of categories/reservations, are to be filled only through online Counselling, i.e., Central/State/UT Counselling as the case may be (except foreign

nationals).

8. Ayush Admissions Central Counselling Committee (AACCC), Ministry of Ayush will conduct “AIQ-PG Online Counselling” for admission to AIQ (15%) seats under Govt./Govt. Aided Colleges/ Central Universities /National Institutes and Deemed Universities (Established under Central Act) of Homoeopathy streams.
9. The State/UT Counselling authorities shall conduct Counselling for admission in 15% of AIQ-PG seats under Private Homoeopathy colleges/institutes/State Universities (other than Deemed Universities established under the Central Act). Further, State/UT Counselling shall be conducted in adherence to guidelines/schedule provided by NCH to avoid the overlapping of the Schedule of AACCC Counselling and State/UT counselling.
10. In case of 85% of State/UT Quota, the seat matrix for Government Quota, Management Quota, NRI Quota etc., shall be as per respective State and UT policy; however, all admissions in all quotas (except foreign nationals) shall be through online Counselling conducted by State/UT Counselling authority.
11. Seat allotment in any category shall be as per inter-se-merit.
12. No candidate who has failed to obtain the minimum eligibility marks in AIAPGET – 2025 shall be admitted to Postgraduate courses for the academic year 2025-26.
13. Qualification Criterion: (As per the Homoeopathy PG Regulations in force at the time of admission)
a) Homoeopathy Post-Graduate Degree Course- Doctor of Medicine in Homoeopathy Regulations,
14. Passing marks for eligibility in admission to Homoeopathy PG courses should be as per the Homoeopathy PG regulations and should be followed strictly. The details of qualifications for different categories are as follows:
 - i. Candidates must possess BHMS/Graded BHMS (after Diploma Course in Homoeopathy of not less than four year's duration) Degree or Provisional degree certificate recognized as per the provisions of NCH 2020 Act and possess permanent or provisional registration certificate issued by the CCH/NCH/State Medicine Board, and must have completed a satisfactorily one- year compulsory rotating internship by 31st August 2025 as per the NCH notification. (for the academic year 2025-26 only)
 - ii. In order to be eligible for admission to postgraduate courses for an academic year, it shall be necessary for a candidate to obtain minimum of marks at 50th percentile in the All-India AYUSH Post Graduate Entrance Test, 2025 (AIAPGET-2025).
Provided that in respect of-
 - A. candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes, the minimum marks shall be at 40th percentile;
 - B. candidates with benchmark disabilities specified under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016), the minimum marks shall be at 45th percentile for the General Category and 40th percentile for the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes.
 - iii. No upper age limit is specified for admission to Homoeopathy PG Courses.
15. No Authority or Institution shall admit any candidate to the Postgraduate courses in contravention of the criteria or procedure in respect of admissions, and any admissions made in contravention shall be cancelled by the NCH

16. Any admissions made beyond/over and above the intake capacity sanctioned/permitted by NCH/GoI for the said academic session shall not be approved.
17. In compliance of the Court order dated 30.11.2023 in SCA No. 19485/2023 at High Court of Gujarat, it is requested all Central/State/UT Counselling Authorities to conduct sufficient phase-wise allotments in stray vacancy round to fill the seats, considering the number of available candidates in the Central/State/UT merit list, whichever is applicable, and availability of vacant seats till that gets filled within the cut-off date of admission as notified by NCH. The guidelines for State/UT Counselling Authorities to conduct the SVR are as follows:
 - a) Publication of non-reported/not-filled seats after R-3 on the State/UT Counselling portal (wide publicity by any other means may also be adopted)
 - b) Publication of ineligible list of candidates who have not complied with the Central/State/UT Counselling rules/norms
 - c) Registration facility for non-registered candidates on the State/UT Counselling portal
 - d) Choice filling facility, as applicable.
 - e) Allotment of seats based on merit and preferences of the candidates.
 - f) Publication of result on the State/UT Counselling portal
 - g) Reporting at the allotted instituteAfter the first phase of allotment in SVR, publish the non-reported/not-filled seats on the State/UT Counselling portal and conduct subsequent rounds to fill the vacant seats, if any, as per the procedure mentioned in the first phase allotment considering the availability of candidates; however, the whole process of SVR allotment need to be completed within the time frame and no admission after the cut-off date decided by NCH shall be allowed/approved.
18. There shall not be any institute-level Counselling through any mode. Any admissions made at the institute level shall not be approved by the NCH/Concerned University and the institute shall be penalised as per the provision laid down under the sub-section (1)(a)(f) of section 28 of NCH Act 2020.
19. There shall not be any offline admission or admission without Counselling (Central/State/UT), and any admissions in contravention of this shall not be approved.
20. NCH shall not approve admissions made without the original documents of the candidates
21. Admission made in violation of the Central Government/ NCH directives will be treated as invalid, and action will be initiated under the NCH Act, 2020
22. Institutes will be held responsible in case students face hardship due to admission irregularities such as offline admissions, admission without Counselling, and admission beyond sanctioned intake capacity. In such case, students shall be discharged from the course and institution, and the institute will be subjected to face consequences as per the provision laid down under the sub-section (1)(a)(f) of section 28; sub-section (3) of section 10 of NCH Act 2020, and the person responsible will be prosecuted as per the section of IPC/BNS concerned.
23. Admissions shall not be approved by any means after the cut-off date and time for admission as specified by NCH.
24. No authority has the power to extend or modify the cut-off date of admission specified by NCH, and such admissions shall not be approved
25. No authority has the power to modify the intake capacity for admission into PG courses in Homeopathy colleges sanctioned by MARBH/ NCH
26. State/UT Counselling Authorities may direct Homeopathy colleges/institutes to ensure the eligibility of the candidate as laid down in respective relevant Homoeopathy Post-Graduate Degree Course- Doctor of

Medicine in Homoeopathy Regulations, for admissions in Homoeopathy-PG courses by proper scrutiny of the relevant original certificates and documents at the time of admission

27. AACCC, M/o Ayush will circulate the list of ineligible candidates to the State/UT Counselling Authority during the 3rd & Stray Vacancy Round (SVR-I & II) of AACCC-PG Counselling to prevent them from participating in the State/UT Counselling. State/UT Counselling Authorities are requested to ensure that such candidates have not been allotted any seat through any rounds of State/UT Counselling for admission in Homeopathy-PG courses
28. Homeopathy colleges/institutes should ensure that the candidates, allotted seats through Central/State/UT Counselling as the case may be, submit the original Compulsory Rotatory Internship completion certificate at the time of reporting to the allotted institutes. The cut-off date for completion of the internship towards determination of eligibility for appearing in AIAPGET-2025 shall be **31st August 2025** (for A.Y.2025-26 only).
29. State/UT Counselling Authorities may direct Homeopathy colleges/institutes to ensure the authenticity and correctness of the details of admitted students before completing the admission procedures. No modifications/ corrections after the cut-off date and time of admission as specified by NCH shall be entertained.
30. Central/State/UT Counselling authorities have to submit a list of admitted students (i.e. college- wise consolidated list of admitted students through all rounds of Counselling) to NCH within 15 working days from the cut-off date of admission in the format and in the manner as prescribed by NCH
31. All State/UT Counselling Authorities are requested to see the website of AACCC, M/o Ayush (<https://aaccc.gov.in>), from time to time for AACCC- PG Counselling scheme & FAQs, Schedule and any updates/notices uploaded regarding All India Quota- Homeopathy-PG Counselling for the A.Y 2025-26
32. State / UT Counselling for Homeopathy-PG courses shall be started only after Central Counselling has commenced, in accordance with the schedule issued by NCH
33. State/UT Counselling Authority shall run an effective **Query Redressal System** to facilitate the counselling and admission process of PG courses and provide the email ID & Phone no of the same on the State/UT Counselling Authority's website.
34. **State Ayush Admissions Reporting Portal:** All State/UT Counselling Authorities are requested to upload the round-wise data on admissions made through State/UT Counselling under 85% of State/UT Quota seats of Govt./Govt. Aided colleges and 100% seats of Private Institutions of Homoeopathy streams all over the Country on the interphase of the AACCC-PG portal.

Determination of fees and other charges in case of ASU colleges/institutes under NCH

35. The fee for 50 percentage (50%) of total sanctioned/permitted seats in Private Homeopathy medical colleges/institutes and deemed universities which are governed under the NCH Act, 2020, is to be determined by Fee fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of the respective State/UT/Deemed University as per the guidelines for "Determination of fee and all other charges" prescribed by NCH (F.No 1-11/2022/NCH/10322-10331 dated 23.11.2022) which has been implemented from the A.Y 2022-23 onwards.

Tuition fee.-

36. All State/UT Counselling authorities are requested to ensure that the institutes only charge the tuition fee, as laid down and fixed by respective governing or fee fixation committees as applicable, in each academic session. No tuition fee shall be charged for an extended study duration in case of failing examinations or other reasons.

II. Directives for State/UT Counselling for admission in 15% of AIQ-PG seats under Private ASU&H colleges/institutes/Private State Universities (other than Deemed Universities established under the Central Act)

1. The State/UT Counselling authorities shall conduct Counselling for 15% of AIQ-PG seats under Private Homeopathy colleges/institutes/Private State Universities (other than Deemed Universities established under the Central Act).
2. State/UT Counselling Authorities have to conduct Counselling for admission in 15% of AIQ-PG seats under Private Homeopathy colleges/institutes/ State Universities (other than Deemed Universities established under Central Act) in adherence with guidelines/schedule provided by NCH to avoid the overlapping of the schedule of AACCC Counselling and State or UT Counselling.
3. State/UT Counselling authorities shall conduct 2 Rounds of Counselling for admission in 15% All India Quota (AIQ) PG seats of Private Homeopathy Institutes/Private State Universities (other than Deemed Universities established under the Central Act). The AIQ seats that remain vacant after the second round of State/UT Counselling may be converted to the State/UT quota seats, and the same shall be filled up in further rounds as per State Government norms/ rules.
4. State/UT Counselling authorities should give wider publicity among AIAPGET- 2025 qualified Homeopathy-PG aspirants regarding the registration process of Counselling & provide sufficient time for registration before each round of Counselling for admission in AIQ-PG seats of Private Homeopathy Institutes
5. State/UT may decide on an all-inclusive application Cost/Non-refundable Registration Fee for Counselling for admission in Homeopathy-PG seats for all category students. **However, the maximum ceiling limit for this fee will be Rs 2000/-**
6. State/UT may decide on refundable security money, which will be refunded to candidates after joining the allotted college or if the candidate did not get any seat during Counselling. **However, the maximum ceiling limit for this fee will be Rs. 50,000/- for PG seats**
7. The Security money will be forfeited if a candidate does not join the Round-2 allotted seat or surrender/withdraw the seat Round-2 joined seat based on the candidate's request. Further, the Security money will also be forfeited if the Round-2 allotted seat is cancelled due to any unforeseen reason from the candidate's end. For example, the candidate gives wrong information at the time of registration based on which a seat may be allotted and later cancelled by the Admission Authorities at the time of reporting or fails to produce the required original documents at the time of admission (within the stipulated time).
8. Make a provision for candidates admitted in the All-India Quota Private (PG) seats during Round2 of State/UT-PG Counselling to withdraw/surrender their admitted seats by forfeiting security money only during a specific time period specified by State/UT authority. Further, State/UT authorities can decide the time period to withdraw/surrender the admitted seat of Round-2 with forfeiture as per their Counselling schedule. After the said period, candidates will not be allowed to withdraw/surrender their Round-2 admitted seats. If they do so, they will be ineligible for any further Ayush Counselling conducted by Central/State/UT as decided by the State/UT Counselling Authorities.
9. No domicile certificate is required for allotment of AIQ- PG seats of Private Homeopathy Institutes
10. **Reservation for allotment of 15% AIQ- PG seats in Private Homeopathy Institutes:** - all AIQ- PG seats of Private Homeopathy Institutes are open in nature (all category candidates are eligible). However, as mentioned in relevant regulations, the relaxation in qualifying criteria may be provided category-wise
11. For PwD candidates, the PwD certificate should be as per the guidelines issued by Central Government and notified by the NCH
12. State/UT Counselling Authority shall run an effective Query Redressal System to facilitate the Counselling and admission process of PG courses and provide email ID & Phone no of the same on the State/UT Counselling Authority's website.

13. As per the Central Government Nominated-PG Counselling guidelines dated **02.05.2025** for the A.Y 2025-26, issued by the Ministry of Ayush, after the admission process of candidates in the CGN quota, the information regarding vacant seats, if any, shall be forwarded to AACCC, MoA for further necessary action. The AACCC, M/o Ayush will apply Centrally approved reservation roster on the vacant seats as per the extant policy/rules and allot these seats to AIAPGET-2025 qualified candidates based on merit and preference submitted by them on the AACCC-PG portal (<https://aaccc.gov.in>).

A. General Information

- Candidates can apply for registration for PG Admission counselling 2025 in “Online” mode only. Submission of Online Application Form may be done by accessing counselling board website www.rajugpgayushcounselling.in. The Application Form other than online mode will not be accepted in any case. Only one application is to be submitted by single candidate.
- Candidates must follow the instructions strictly as given in the Information booklet available on counselling board website. Candidates not complying with the instructions shall be summarily disqualified.
- Candidates must ensure that e-mail address and Mobile Number provided in the Online Application Form are their own as all information/communication will be sent by counselling board on your e-mail address or SMS on given Mobile Number only.
 - ❖ Instructions for filling Online Application Form
 - ❖ Download Information booklet and read these carefully to ensure your eligibility.
 - ❖ Follow the 4 steps given below to Apply Online:
 - Step-1:** Fill in the Online Application Form and note down the system generated Application number.
 - Step-2:** Upload scanned images of Candidate’s Photograph, Domicile Certificate, Caste Certificate (if applicable), Secondary Mark sheet, Senior Secondary Mark sheet, Mark sheets of B.H.M.S. (1st to Final), Internship certificate, Registration Certificate, AIAPGET-2025 Admit Card, AIAPGET-2025 Mark sheet in JPG/JPEG format.
 - Step-3:** Make payment of fee using appropriate payment mode through appropriate payment gateway and keep proof of fee paid.
 - Step-4:** Print at least two copies of Confirmation Page after successful remittance of fee.
 - ❖ **All the 4 Steps can be done together or at separate times.**

Note: -

- The final submission of Online Application Form will remain incomplete if Step-2 and step-3 are not completed. Such forms will stand rejected and no correspondence on this account will be entertained.
- No request for refund of fee once remitted by the candidate will be entertained by counselling board under any circumstances.
- The entire application process of PG counselling is online, including uploading of scanned images, Payment of Fees, and Printing of Confirmation Page. Therefore, candidates are not required to send/submit any document(s) including Confirmation Page to Counselling Board through Post/ Fax/ By hand.
- Candidates are advised to **keep visiting the Counselling Board website regularly** for latest updates.

2. Registration Fee:

- 2.1 All candidates are required to deposit registration fee of Rs. **2000/-** (for General, EWS & OBC candidates) and Rs. **1500/-** (for SC/ ST candidate of Rajasthan state domicile) through Internet banking / Debit card / Credit card. The registration fee is neither refundable, nor transferable and nor adjustable for any future State PG admissions. Any plea in this matter shall not be entertained. Please keep the information submitted in application form confidential and do not share with anybody. If you don't register during registration period, you will not be allotted any seat. Please also note that registration will be available once only.
- 2.2 AIAPGET-2025 qualified candidates may apply for counselling and admission to Homeopathy PG Institutions in Rajasthan, if eligible based on applicable rules, regulations, reservation policy and other criteria specified by Govt. of India/ Govt. of Rajasthan respectively.
- 2.3 Counselling Board will propose its own merit list considering AIAPGET-2025 merit list and based on its applicable rules regulations, reservation policy and other criteria.
- 2.4 Counselling will be conducted **online**. Merit list will be prepared on the basis registered eligible applicants as per rules. All admission will be made to the meritorious candidates as per rules of counselling

3. General Instructions, Terms and Conditions

- Applicants may note that appearance in PG Counselling 2025 does not confer any automatic rights to secure an admission in AYUSH Post Graduate MD courses. The selection and admission to Postgraduate seats in any AYUSH institution(s) recognized for running MD courses as per the NCH Act is subject to fulfilling the admission criteria, eligibility, medical fitness and other criteria as prescribed by the respective universities, AYUSH institutions, NCH, State/Central Government
- Online Registration process will be conducted as per time schedule available at website.
- Applications of candidates producing false or fabricated information will not be considered and such candidates may be debarred from appearing in any future counselling conducted by counselling board.
- Before initiating registration process, candidates should go through the Information Booklet carefully for eligibility criteria, scheme and pattern of counselling etc. Any queries and other issues will only be entertained if the requested information is not given in the Information Booklet.
- Incomplete application, if not in accordance with instructions, will not be considered and is liable to be rejected. Applicant should carefully fill up all the fields during registration process. **Application cannot be modified/edited at any circumstances.**
- Instructions in the Information-Booklet are liable to change based on decisions taken by the Constitutional Authorities.
- Counselling Board reserves the right to withdraw permission, if any, granted inadvertently to any candidate who is not eligible to appear in PG Counselling even though Registration number has been issued or is displayed on website
- The Counselling Board does not verify the information provided by candidates during online registration. Therefore, candidature will be purely provisional and is subject to the fulfillment of eligibility criteria as specified in the Information Booklet for PG Counselling, as well as the requirements of NCH, State authorities, Universities, or the concerned Institutions.
- Candidates must verify from the respective state government/ Universities and Institutes if at all they will be considered for admission to All India Quota (in private college). State Quota Post Graduate seats based on applicable regulations and /or domicile criteria, State/Institute of Graduation, reservation policy fee structure etc. Merely appearing in AIAPGET 2025 does not make a candidate qualified and/or eligible for All India quota (in private seats)/State Quota seats for admission.

ADMISSION COUNSELLING IN Part-I of M.D. (Homoeopathy)
Course FOR THE ACADEMIC SESSION 2025-26
COMMON FEATURES**

1. Qualification for Admission:

1.1 Homoeopathy Degree (Bachelor of Homoeopathy Medicine & Surgery) of Universities of Rajasthan OR any equivalent examination recognized by NCH New Delhi.

1.2 No candidate shall be admitted to M.D. (Homeopathy) course unless he possesses the degree of:

- i. Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery or equivalent qualification in Homoeopathy included in the Second Schedule to the Act, after undergoing a course of study of not less than five year and six months duration including one-year compulsory internship; or
- ii. Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery (Graded Degree) or equivalent qualification in Homoeopathy include in the Second Schedule to the Act, after undergoing a course of study of not less than two years' duration.
- iii. Candidates who have qualified in the AIPGET-2025 can participate in the counselling for admission in MD course for the academic year 2025-26.
- iv. Minimum qualifying marks for AIPGET-2025 will be as specified in existing PG Regulation (NCH) as given below:

- In order to be eligible for admission to postgraduate courses for an academic year, it shall be necessary for a candidate to obtain minimum of marks at 50th percentile in the All-India AYUSH Post Graduate Entrance Test, 2025 (AIAPGET- 2025).

Provided that in respect of-

(a) candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes, the minimum marks shall be at 40th percentile;

(b) candidates with benchmark disabilities specified under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016), the minimum marks shall be at 45th percentile for the General Category and 40th percentile for the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes.

A. Candidates: Must have completed the twelve-months rotating Internship/House Job, as the case may be, after passing the qualifying examination **by 31 August 2025 or as decided by The Ministry of AYUSH, Government of India.**

B. The online application form and time schedule are available on the Board website www.rajugpgayushcounselling.in

2. Counselling Procedure:

- i. Admission will be subject to the rules & regulation of the respective institutes.
- ii. Counselling Board reserves the right to correct any inadvertent error in any merit list and also in the prospectus.
- iii. The Counselling Board shall conduct online counselling of the candidates and allot the institute/college and Subjects taking into an account the scheme of distribution of reserved seats, merit lists of respective categories, the order of the merit of AIAPGET 2025, preference and availability of seats.\
- iv. Candidates must possess BHMS Degree or Provisional degree certificate recognized as per the provisions of the HCC 1973/ NCH 2020 Act and possess permanent or provisional registration certificate issued by the CCH/NCH/ State Board, and must have completed a satisfactorily one-year compulsory rotating internship by **31 August 2025** as per the NCH notification. (for the academic year 2025-26 only)
- v. Vacant seats arising due to any reason shall be filled by up-gradation on the basis of Reservations and Merit-cum-Preference List.
- vi. No TA/D.A. will be paid to the candidates for appearing in document verification after the allotment of seat in online counselling.

3. Counselling, Merit List, Subject Preference and Allotment:

- i. The eligible candidates will be allotted seats in institutions through online process on the basis of provisional merit list, Category, Subjects wise available seats, preference provided by the candidate in choice filling format and based on the data/Information of eligible candidates from the National Testing Agency, i.e., the AIAPGET- 2025 examination conducting body.
- ii. Candidate will have to deposit counselling fee Rs 30000/- (Rs Thirty Thousand only) through Net-banking/Credit Card/Debit Card by last date of choice filling till (As per Schedule available on website) and to submit choice filling Performa failing which their admission shall cancelled and they will not eligible to participate in counselling process.
- iii. Once seats and college are allotted to the candidate in 1st round of counselling, the candidate will have to report in person at allotted reporting center and deposit prescribed remaining college annual fee only through Online mode/Demand Draft in favor of (**CHAIRMAN, AYUSH UG ADMISSION COUNSELLING BOARD,**) **Payable at Jaipur**, during stipulated period of time. This candidate will also be eligible for 2nd round of counselling for upgradation. if he/she fills fresh choice filling form for 2nd round.
- iv. If candidate doesn't report to the reporting center and doesn't deposit the prescribed remaining college annual fee with in stipulated period of time, his/her allotment will be cancelled and that seat will be treated as vacant seat. However, he/she may participate in 2nd round of counselling without forfeiting Counselling Fee as a last chance but he/she have to fill fresh choice filling form for 2nd round of counselling. For such candidates, seats will be allotted on availability of seats and on the basis of fresh merit list of 2nd Round.
- v. After the allotment of 2nd round, candidates who got allotted seats will have an option to surrender his/her seat only within the duration of **three days** after date of allotment along with the condition of forfeiting his/her **Counselling fee (Security Money)** After the said period, candidates will not be allowed to withdraw/surrender their admitted seats of 2nd round. If they do so, they will be ineligible for any further AYUSH Counselling conducted by Central/State/UT.
- vi. If candidate after getting seat allotment in 1st round or 2nd round fails to report at reporting centers at the office of Counselling Board, Jaipur on due date and time, his/her seat allotment will stand cancelled and counselling fee will be forfeited and will not be refunded in any circumstances. He/she may participate in next round of counselling in case of vacant position if any, only after fresh deposit of counselling fee Rs. 30000/- (Rs Thirty Thousand only).
- vii. The counselling fee will be forfeited in case the candidate gives wrong information at the time of application on the basis of which a seat may be allotted and later cancelled by the Admission Authorities at the time of reporting.
- viii. Those who applied but not allotted a seat in first round as well as in second round will be considered for mop-up round of counselling (without fresh application form i.e., need not fill the application form again).
- ix. **Candidates without original certificates/documents shall not be allowed to take admission to the allotted Homeopathy College. Candidates who have deposited their original documents in any other Institute/College/University and come for admission with a certificate/undertaking stating that "original certificates are deposited with the Institute/College/University" or bring color photo copy of original documents shall not be allowed to take admission in allotted College.**
- x. The Counselling Board shall provide the list of provisionally allotted candidates to the concerned college.
- xi. Candidates are advised to visit Counselling Board Website and daily newspapers time to time for information of dates and other information for participation in various rounds of counselling.
- xii. The Actual Admissions in a particular Institute will be subject to the rules and regulations of that Institute.

4. REPORTING TO COLLEGE AFTER COUNSELLING/JOINING TIME

- i. Each candidate shall be given the time as mentioned in the allotment letter, issued on line, to join the allotted college and course. There is no provision of extension for joining date under any circumstances. The allotment made will be firm and final. Change of college/course from one place to another is not permitted. Therefore, request for the same would not be entertained by the Counselling Board after the allotment, except the candidate can opt for 2nd round of counselling for change of college as per allotment.
- ii. While reporting for admission, please carry all the relevant certificates/documents in original and also submit an undertaking (Proforma-1) on (Non-Judicial Stamp of Rs 50) that the submitted documents are in original.
- iii. The selected candidates will be required to undergo medical examination at the allotted institution on the notified date(s).
- iv. Candidates who fail to attend medical examination on the notified date are liable to forfeit the claim for admission. Candidates who have been admitted must join their classes on the date to be notified.
- v. The allotment for this admission will be cancelled if the selected candidates do not report to the allotted college up to the stipulated date or whose particulars are not found correct or who are found medically unfit.
- vi. The selected candidates must also carry all requisite certificates and documents in original and also submit an undertaking that the submitted documents are in original along with 2 sets of printout of application form along with self-attested 2 sets of photocopies of the documents, at the time of reporting in Round 1/Round 2/mop-up round and shall deposit the applicable fees of the allotted college and complete other formalities within stipulated time, failing which their admission shall stand cancelled.
- vii. The non-viewing of the websites about allotment information by the candidate shall not be accepted as a ground for non-reporting on the scheduled time and date. The candidate's allotment will stand automatically cancelled if he/she does not report IN PERSON at the office of Counselling Board, Jaipur, as per the notified schedule.
- viii. A candidate shall have to deposit the full fee (Remaining) of the college for the session 2025-26, only through Online mode/demand draft on reporting center at the office of Counselling Board within the notified time.

5. IMPORTANT

- i. The candidates who do not join the allotted college will be treated as fresh candidate in the subsequent round of counselling.
- ii. Admission will be cancelled if the selected candidates do not report to the allotted college and Deposit fees within stipulated period.

Note: - 1. No admission will be done by UG PG AYUSH Counselling Board, Rajasthan after cutoff date decided by Ministry of AYUSH, Govt. of India, New Delhi.

❖ Furthermore, candidates who were allotted state quota/AIQ seats in previous rounds by this Counselling Board, will have to vacate their seats and will have to proceed with admission in an AIQ seat allocated by AACCC in any round, if the case may be. Failure to do so will render them ineligible for the entire counseling session

2. The candidates, who have been found ineligible by AACCC for participation in admission counselling process in any state/stage will not be eligible for participation in admission counselling being conducted by this Counselling Board.

6. Reservations, Subjects and Admission Capacity:

Subjects, Reservations & Admission Capacity are different in different Institutes.

- The distribution of seats in a particular institute will be as per the Rules & Regulations of the respective Institution and State Govt. of Rajasthan, Govt. of India and NCH, New Delhi.
- Certain Seats are reserved for PH Candidates horizontally. These seats shall be filled from the Candidates belonging to the relevant PH Category on the basis of Merit.

I. PwBD- 5% (Horizontal Reservation, i.e., 5% in each of OPEN, GEN-EWS, OBC-NCL, SC, and ST category seats

Provisions relating to Persons with Benchmark Disability (PwBD): As per Section 2(t) of the RPwD Act, “Persons with Benchmark Disability (PwBD)” means a person with long term physical, mental, intellectual, or sensory impairment which, in interaction with barriers, hinders his full and effective participation in society equally with others. According to Section 2(r) of the RPwD Act, 2016, “persons with benchmark disabilities” means a person with not less than forty percent (40%) of a specified disability where specified disability has not been defined in measurable terms and includes a person with disability where specified disability has been defined in measurable terms, as certified by the certifying authority. Disability certificate as per 21 Benchmark Disabilities given under RPWD Act 2016, from the designated disability Centers as per the list enclosed as **ANNEXURE II**. The certificate issued by any other hospital/board will not be accepted. Further, the format of ‘Certificate of Disability’ is attached in **Annexure-I Seats**
